TAX PLANNING, TAX MANAGEMENT, TAX AVOIDANCE AND TAX EVASION

Introduction

It has been observed that there is a constant struggle between taxpayers and tax collectors, the former trying to reduce (if not negate) their tax liability, and the latter seriously struggling to plug in the loopholes in the statute.

Tax Planning/ Avoidance/Evasion-Concept

Following are certain cases one can follow to understand the above concepts :

Case 1: Y is an individual. For the assessment year 2022-23, his gross total income is Rs. 12,90,000 Tax on Rs. 12,90,000 is Rs. 2,07,480. To reduce his tax liability, he deposits Rs. 1,50,000 in public provident fund account. Consequently, his taxable income and tax liability thereof will be reduced to Rs. 11,40,000 and Rs. 1,60,680 respectively.

As the tax liability has been reduced within the legal framework, it is tax planning.

Case 2 :Z Ltd. is a manufacturing company. It has a factory in Haryana near Delhi border. Within the factory campus, a piece of land of 2000 square metre is lying unutilized. The company wants to start a new unit to manufacture computer components. If this manufacturing unit is started in the existing factory campus, deduction under section 80-IB is not available. However, if the new unit is started in Jammu & Kashmir, the company can claim deduction under section 80-IB. To get the benefit of deduction under section 80-IB, the company starts the new unit in a village near Jammu.

The company has two options. Under one of the options, deduction under section 80-IB is not available. However, this deduction is available under the other option. To get the benefit of deduction under section 80-IB, the new unit has been started in Jammu & Kashmir. As the tax liability has been reduced to get the benefit of deduction available under the income-tax, it is tax planning.

Case 3: Suppose in Case 2, the process of manufacturing actually takes place in Haryana. To get the benefit of deduction under section 80-IB, the company takes a factory building on rent in avillage in Jammu and only on paper it is shown that the new manufacturing unit is situated in a village near Jammu.

As the company wants to reduce the tax liability by making incorrect statement about the location of manufacturing process, it is tax evasion.

What is tax Planning?

Tax planning can be defined as an arrangement of one's financial and economic affairs by taking complete legitimate benefit of all deductions, exemptions, allowances and rebates so that tax liability reduces to minimum. Essential features of tax planning are as under-

It comprises arrangements by which tax laws are fully complied. All legal obligations and transactions (both individually and as a whole) are met.

Transactions do not take the form of colourable devices (i.e., those devices where statute is followed in strict words but actually spirit behind the statute is marred would be termed as colourable devices). There is no intention to deceit the legal spirit behind the tax law.

What is tax Avoidance?

The line of demarcation between tax planning and tax avoidance is very thin and blurred. The English courts about eight decades ago recognized the right of a taxpayer to resort to the legal method of tax avoidance. It is well settled that it is unconstitutional for the Government to attempt tax collection without the authority of law or legal basis. Similarly, a taxpayer cannot escape tax payment outside the legal framework, as he renders himself liable for prosecution as a tax evader.

Tax avoidance is reducing or negating tax liability in legally permissible ways and has legal sanction. Essential features of tax avoidance are as under-. Legitimate arrangement of affairs in such a way so as to minimize tax liability.

Avoidance of tax is not tax evasion and carries no public disgrace with it.

An act valid in law cannot be treated as fictitious merely on the basis of some underlying motive supposedly resulting in lower payment of tax to authorities.

There is no element of mala fide motive involved in tax avoidance. Over and over again, the courts have said that there is nothing sinister in so arranging one's affairs as to keep taxes as low as possible. Tax avoidance is sound law and certainly not



bad morality for any body to so arrange his affairs in such a way that the brunt of taxation is the minimum. This can be done within the legal framework even by taking help of loopholes in the law. If on account of a lacuna in the law or otherwise, the assessee is able to avoid payment of tax within the letter of law, it cannot be said that the action is void because it is intended to save payment of tax. So long as the law exists in its present form, the taxpayer is entitled to take its advantage.

What is tax Evasion?

5. All methods by which tax liability is illegally avoided are termed as tax evasion. An assessee guilty of tax evasion may be punished under the relevant laws. Tax evasion may involve stating an untrue statement knowingly, submitting misleading documents, suppression of facts, not maintaining proper

accounts of income earned (if required under law), omission of material facts on assessment. All such procedures and methods are required by the statute to be abided with but the assessee who dishonestly claims the benefit under the statute before complying with the said abidance by making false statements, would be within the ambit of tax evasion.

A person may plan his finances in such a manner, strictly within the four corners of the taxing statute that his tax liability is minimised or made nil If this is done and as observed strictly in accordance with and taking advantage of the provisions contained in the Act, by no stretch of imagination can it be said that payment of tax has been evaded for. In the context of payment of tax, 'evasion' necessarily means, 'to try illegally to avoid paying tax-CIT v. Sri Abhayananda Rath Family Benefit Trust [2002] 123 Taxman 81 (Ori)

TAX PLANNING v. TAX MANAGEMENT

The following are the broad areas of distinction between the two:

Tax Avoidance v. Tax Evasion

Tax Avoidance	Tax Evasion
1. Any planning of tax which aims at reducing or negating tax liability in legally recognised permissible ways, can be termed as an instance of tax avoidance. 2 Tax avoidance takes into account the loop- holes of law. 3. Tax avoidance is tax hedging within the framework of law. 4 Tax avoidance has legal sanctions. 5. Tax avoidance is intentional tax planning before the actual tax liability arises.	1. All methods by which tax liability is illegally avoided is termed as tax evasion. 2 Tax evasion is an attempt to evade tax liability with the help of unfair means/methods. 3. Tax evasion is tax omission. 4. Tax evasion is unlawful and an assessee guilty of tax evasion may be punished under the relevant laws. 5. Tax evasion is an intentional attempt to avoid payment of tax after the liability to tax has arisen.

7. Tax management involves the procedures of compliance with the statutory provisions of law. The following are the broad areas of distinction between tax planning and tax management.

Tax Planning v. Tax Management

1. The objective of tax planning is to reduce the tax liability to the minimum. 2 Tax planning is futuristic in its approach. 3. Tax planning is very wide in its coverage and includes tax management. 4. The benefits arising from tax planning are substantial particularly in the long run.	1. The objective of tax management is to comply with the provisions of law. 2. Tax management relates to past (i.e. assessment proceedings, rectification, revision, appeals etc.), present (filing of return of income on time on the basis of updated records) and future (corrective action). 3. Tax management has a limited scope, i.e., it deals with specific activities such as filing of returns of income on time, drafting appeals, deduction of tax at source on time, updating records from time to time, etc. 4. As a result of effective tax management, penalty, penal interest, prosecution, etc., can be avoided.

Importance of Chemical Sector in Human Life

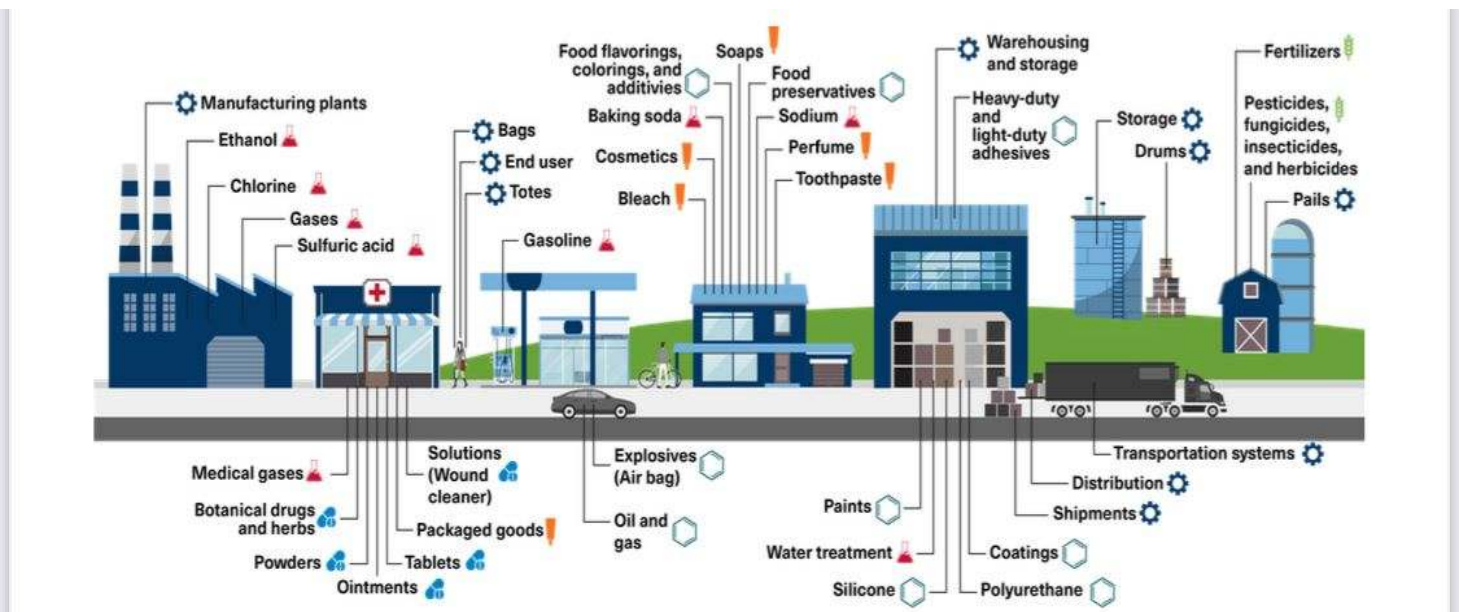

Global Chemical Sector Performance

The COVID19 pandemic revealed the fragility of supply chains, primarily through distribution issues for the chemical Sector across the globe. According to Statista 2021, the total revenue of the global chemical industry amounted to over US\$ 4.7 trillion. The ACC survey of chemical manufacturers highlighted that 55% of chemical manufacturers reported port-related delays and congestion have worsened since Q3 2021.

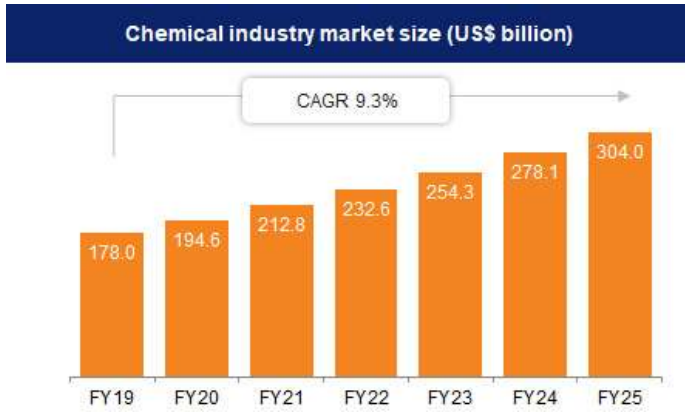
39% of chemical manufacturers reported road and rail transport related delays and service challenges have worsened since Q3 2021. Many road and rail users reported longer transit times, typically about eight days to more than three weeks.

However, global challenges were there due to various reasons nevertheless Indian chemical news reported that India's chemical sector performed worth US\$ 220 billion in 2022 and has been anticipated to grow to US\$ 300 billion by 2025 and US\$ 1 trillion by 2040.



Covering more than 80,000 commercial products, India's chemical industry is extremely diversified across India starting from Gujarat, to Maharashtra, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, and Uttar Pradesh. The sector is ranked the 6th largest globally by output and 3rd in Asia. Contributing a substantial 7% to India's GDP. According to IB from Dezan Shira and Associates, India's thriving chemical industry owes its success to escalating demand and supportive government policies.

Government initiatives, including chemical development schemes, chemical and plastics parks etc. are fueling investment opportunities. Notably, the chemical industry allows 100% FDI through the automatic route, with the exception of certain hazardous chemicals like acetone, acrylonitrile, aldrin, and alkyl phthalate among others which are capable of causing major

accident hazards. The Indian chemical sector can be broadly classified into bulk chemicals, specialty chemicals, agrochemicals, petrochemicals, polymers, and fertilisers. Globally, India is the fourth-largest producer of agrochemicals after the United States, Japan and China. India accounts for 16-18% of the world production of dyestuffs and dye intermediates. Indian colorants industry has emerged as a key player with a global market share of ~15%. The country's chemicals industry is de-licensed, except for a few hazardous chemicals.

India holds a strong position in exports and imports of chemicals at a global level and ranks 14th in exports and 8th in imports (excluding pharmaceuticals). The pharmaceutical industry includes the manufacturing, extraction, processing, purification, and packaging of chemical materials to be used as medications. Pharmaceutical facilities primarily engage in one or more of the following: manufacturing of biological and medical products; processing of botanical drugs and herbs; isolating active medical principles from botanical drugs and herbs; and/or manufacturing of pharmaceutical products intended for internal and external consumption in forms such as tablets, capsules, ointments, powders, and solutions are all considered chemical products in broader term.

Gujarat Chemical Industry Synopsis

Gujarat is the largest state contributor to the chemical industry in India. 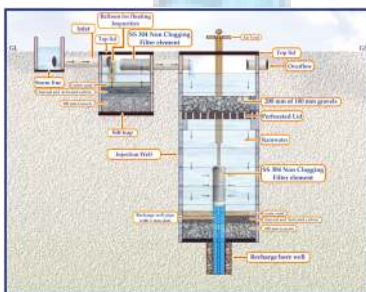

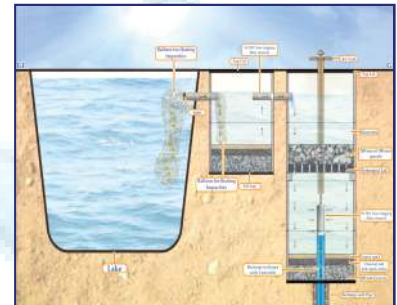

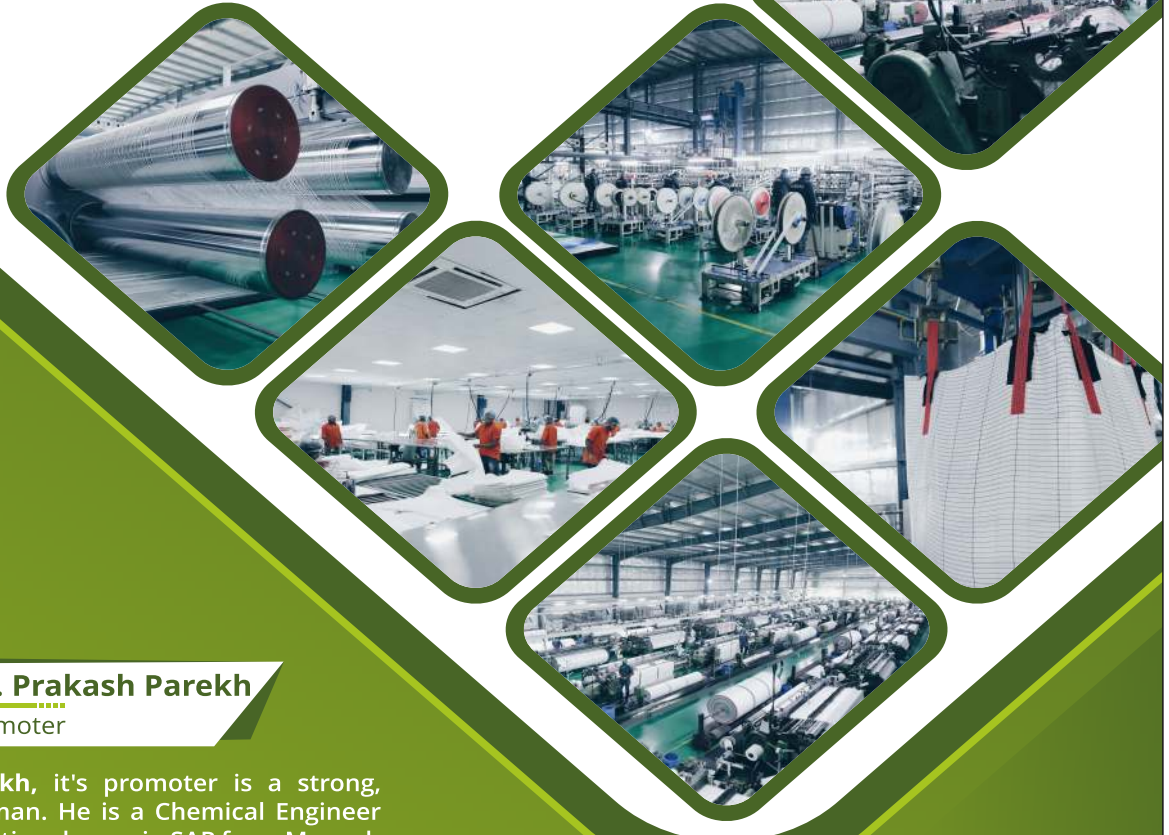

GST Advisory for reporting Opening balance of ITC reversal pending to be re-claimed as on 31 August 2023

Background:

- Reclaimable ITC is reversed in Table 4(b)(2) of GSTR 3B (as temporary reversals) and can be subsequently reclaimed in Table 4(a)(5) on fulfilment of eligibility conditions for ITC availment.
- Such reclaimed ITC in Table 4(a)(5) also needs to be disclosed in Table 4(d)(1).

Changes in GST Portal:

- A new ledger '**Electronic Credit Reversal and Re-claimed Statement**' is made available on GST Portal, which intends to capture **YTD balance of 'ITC reversal pending re-claim'** in GST return.
- This statement aims to help taxpayers in tracking their ITC reversal and reclaim through Table 4(a)(5), 4(d)(1) and 4(b)(2).

GSTN Advisory

- Taxpayers are required to report YTD balance of re-claimable ITC which has been reversed upto 30 August 2023 i.e. vide GSTR 3B **return filed for the month of July 2023** (the re-claimable ITC reported should satisfies conditions for eligibility prescribed under GST Law);
- Last date to report such balance is **30 November 2023**;
- Opening balance reported can be **amended upto 3 times upto 31 December 2023**;
- As per the advisory, the ITC Reversal value will be sent to the Jurisdictional Tax Officer for review.

Our Analysis:

- The opening balance that has been reported or amended by the taxpayers shall be credited to the 'Electronic Credit Reversal and Re-claimed Statement'.
- This statement will be used to validate the ITC re-claim amount in Table 4(a)(5) and 4D(1) of form GSTR-3B. A warning message might trigger if the taxpayer re-claims ITC in excess of balance in ledger.

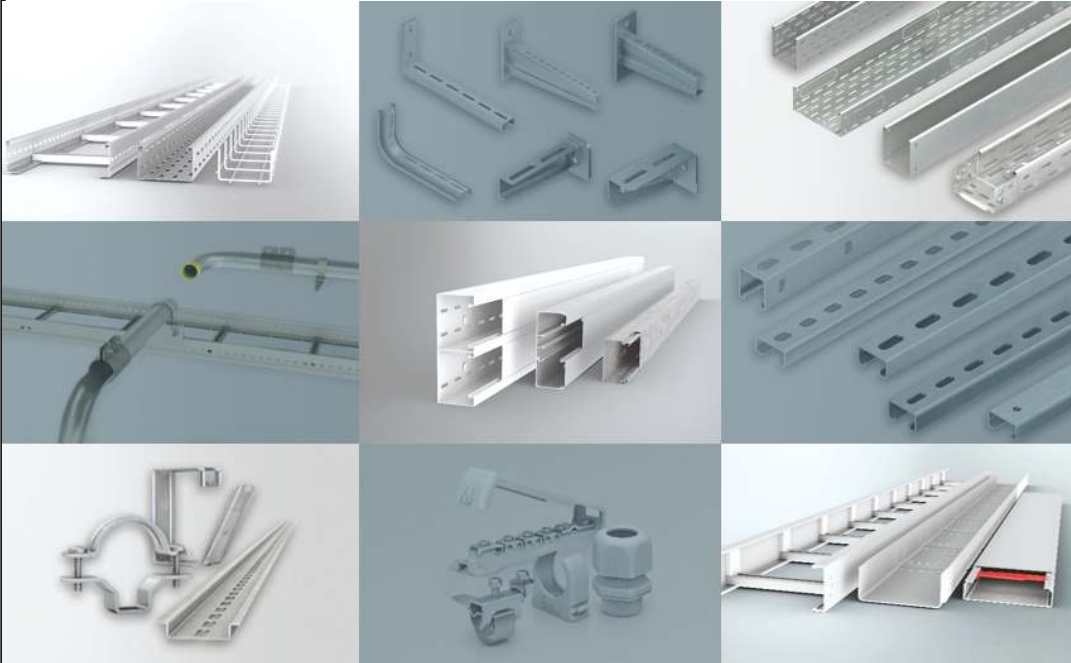

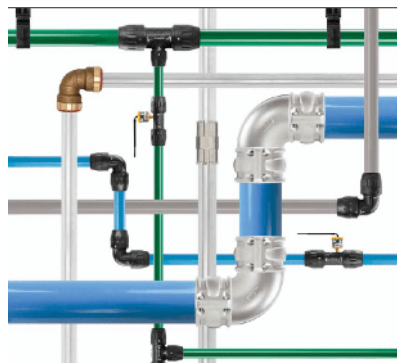

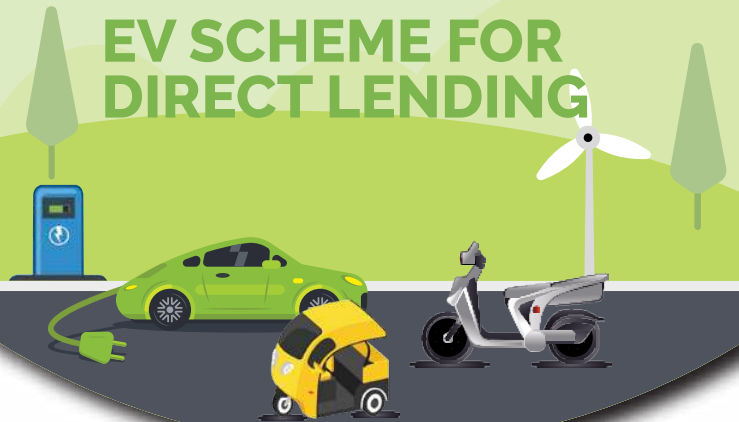
